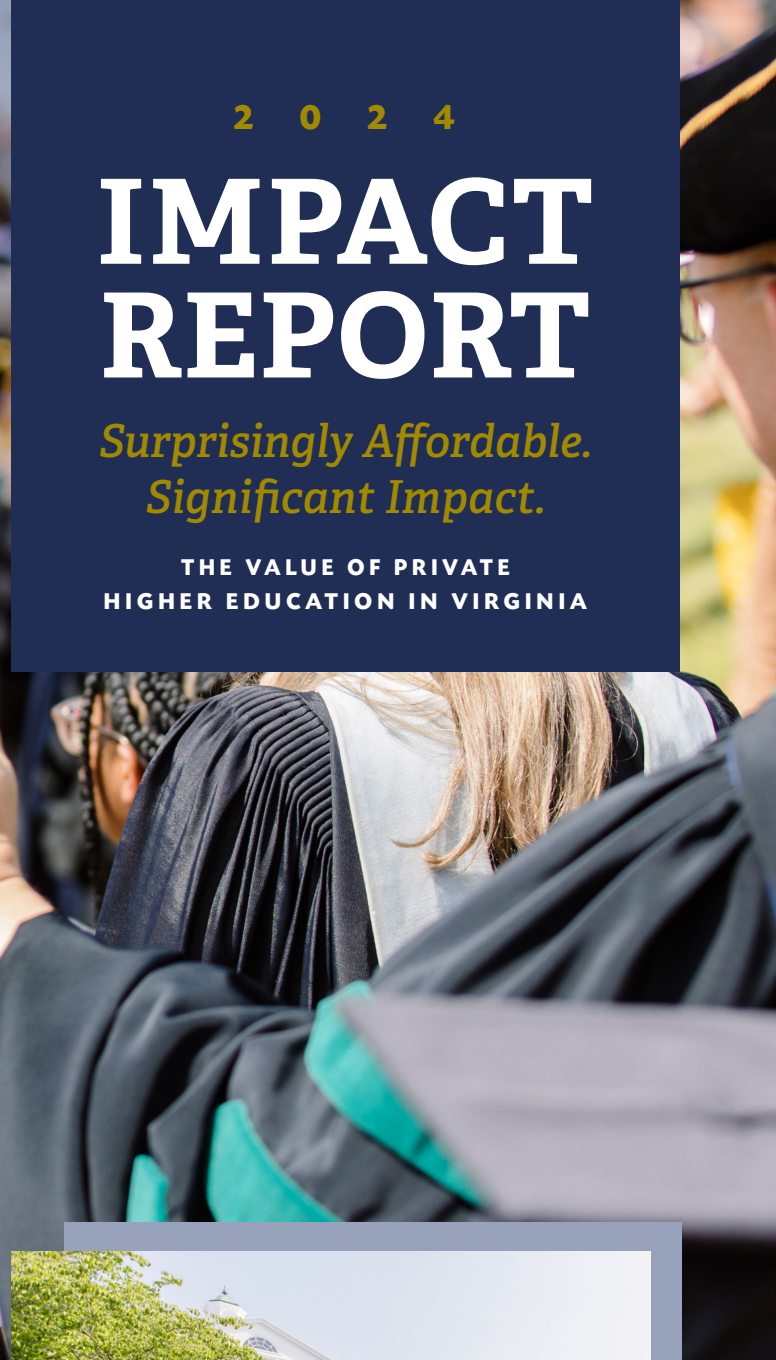

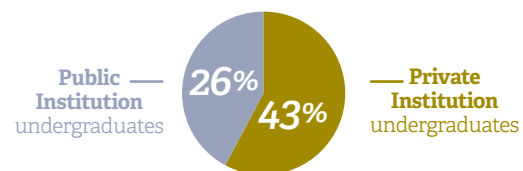

43% of undergraduates in the Fall of 2022 were Pell Grant Recipients (compared to **26%** in Virginia's public 4-year colleges and universities)

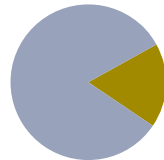


THE BEST VALUE FOR THE STATE:

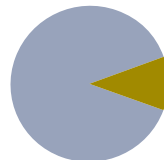

Lower costs to operate

In FY 23, Virginia's public colleges and universities received nearly **\$2.2B** in taxpayer funding for education and general expenses compared to only just over **\$100M** for private higher education.

Higher taxpayer returns

Virginia Private Colleges generated **\$157.0 M** in state and local tax revenue. When compared to the **\$100M** in state spending on the Tuition Assistance Grant (TAG), the taxpayer return is nearly **1:2**. For every **\$43** invested, the state and local tax return is **\$78**.

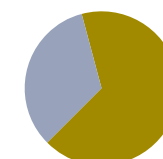

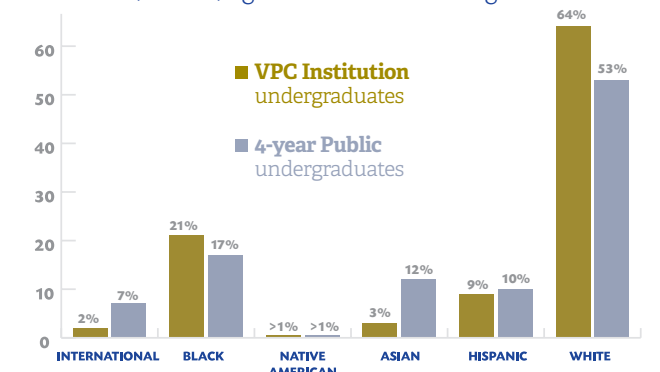

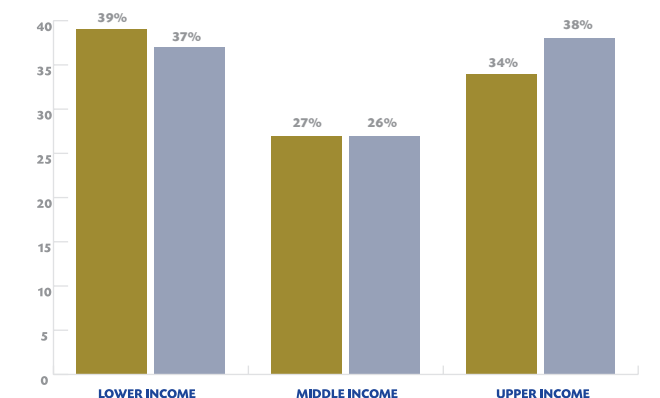

Virginia Private Colleges provide convenient educational access to underserved and isolated areas of the state. Many of VPC institutions are located in areas of Virginia, such as Southwest and Southern Virginia, where public four-year colleges and universities have a limited presence and in areas of the state where employment opportunities are limited. They are often one of the largest employers in their communities.

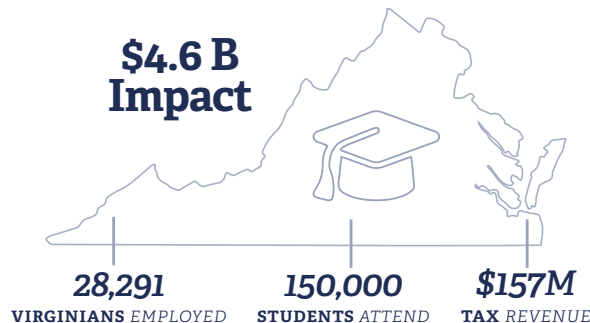
